Whereas the Ontario Building Code Act, 1992 S.O. 1992, Chapter 23 as amended regulates issuing of building permits which under Section 8, Clause (2) (a) The Chief Building Official shall issue a permit unless the proposed building, construction or demolition will contravene the Act, the building code or any other applicable law:

And Whereas Ontario Regulation 191/14 Amending O. Reg 332/12 sets out in Division A, Section 1.4.3, the current Definition of Applicable Law which includes the Planning Act with respect to Zoning;

And whereas the Chief Building Official may revoke a permit issued under the Building Code Act if were issued on mistaken, false or incorrect information;

And whereas the ministerial zoning order issued on July 18, 2013 provided approval for 73 hectares (180 acres) of "prime agricultural" land to be converted into a major industrial development to construct a Distribution Centre located on the west side of Coleraine Drive, between Healy Road and Holland Drive;

And whereas the ministerial zoning order that is currently referred to the Ontario Municipal Board;

Therefore be it resolved that Council directs the Chief Building Official to revoke the building permit issued on July 18, 2013 until such time as the court decides on the minster's order.

Councillor J. Innis raised a Point of Order with regard to the Motion indicating that she believed that item is not within the scope of Council's decision-making. Councillor J. Innis requested Legal Staff to provide advice regarding the matter. Solicitor P. De Sario stated that in her opinion, the Motion is not within Council's jurisdiction.

As a result, with the consent of Council, the Motion was Withdrawn.

Whereas highways and passenger rail services under Provincial jurisdiction are needed to implement the province's Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe by 2031; and

Whereas a GO rail service between Bolton and Union Station is identified by Metrolinx' Regional Transportation Plan (The Big Move) as a required facility; and

Whereas a Metrolinx feasibility study in 2010 has concluded that a GO rail service to Bolton is feasible; and

Whereas a GO rail service between Bolton and Union Station can significantly reduce the rush hour traffic volume through Vaughan and Etobicoke and ease traffic congestion along the Highway 427 and Regional Road 50 corridors; and

Whereas the Town of Caledon has planned a substantial amount of growth in the vicinity of the GO rail station, as identified by the Metrolinx study, to build a transit-supportive community within the 2031 timeframe; and

Whereas both the Federal and Provincial governments have proposed increased and sustained long term funding for municipal infrastructure;

Therefore be it resolved that staff be directed to work with his Worship Mayor Thompson to compose a letter to the Chair of Metrolinx to petition a timely delivery of the GO rail service to Bolton; and

Further that the letter request Metrolinx to provide the details as to the timing of the project, financial commitment, as well as plans to acquire the lands needed; and

Further that a copy of this letter be sent to David Tilson MP, Sylvia Jones MPP, the Regional Chairs of Peel and York, as well as the Mayors of Toronto, Vaughan, Mississauga and Brampton for their information and to seek their support.
