More than 5 million people globally live with inflammatory bowel disease, Canada has one of the highest prevalence rates in the world. By 2030, experts predict the number of Canadians living with inflammatory bowel disease to exceed 400,000 – one percent of the population. Currently, there is no cure; and

Whereas, Every November, Canada celebrates Crohn's and Colitis Awareness Month and red is worn to show support for the initiative.
