SUMMARY OF INDIGENOUS ENGAGEMENT ON THE MAYFIELD GOLF COURSE REDEVELOPMENT ARCHAEOLOGICAL ASSESSMENTS

Dear Vimal,

This letter provides a summary of Indigenous engagement activities conducted as part of the archaeological assessments (AAs) conducted in support of the proposed residential redevelopment of the Mayfield Golf Club, including the existing Mayfield Golf Club, as well as the existing residential property at 12580 Torbram Road and the Mayfield South Lands, a 20.7-hectare agricultural field adjacent to the Mayfield Golf Club. Engagement was initiated by Mayfield Golf Club Inc. c/o Geranium. Indigenous communities whose traditional territory encompasses the proposed development were engaged, including:

- Huron-Wendat First Nation
- Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation
- Six Nations of the Grand River
- Haudenosaunee Development Institute

The Stage 1 AA draft report was provided to each of the Indigenous communities for review and comment prior to its submission to the Ministry of Citizenship and Multiculturalism (MCM) for review. Following this, WSP archaeologists led the engagement for the Stage 2 AA by coordinating with each community during the Stage 2 fieldwork to facilitate their participation and input during the program. Representatives from all communities attended most of the fieldwork, and representatives from at least one of the communities were on site for each day of fieldwork.

As the Stage 2 AA of the Mayfield South Lands is currently ongoing, engagement with each of these Indigenous communities will continue for the duration of the project and subsequent AAs.
